## SPONSORSHIP AGREEMENT

Professional Event Solutions (PES), of San Diego and Scott Hubbell Productions (SHP), of Malibu, both presented proposals for replacing Dick Colosi as the promotional firm for CSLSA. After considerable time and effort on the part of Mr. Rohrer and myself, in providing information and negotiating agreements, the Executive Board voted to sign with PES.
PES has been working hard to obtain suitable sponsorships for our various programs, but because of the late signing date, has had little success to date. The Executive Board was prepared for this eventuality and took steps to keep the ball rolling while PES works on our behalf. We expect that the fruits of their labors will be felt more positively in 2002.

## WEBSITE REDESIGN \& MAINTENANCE

Following all the excellent work by Ki Weisser and the services of Marc Penis of OC Visions, our web site has a new look. The completely revised site has several new features that make the site more appealing to the eye and easier to navigate. Mr. Panis provided a sound basis for our site to grow in the future.
In March the Executive Board signed an agreement with Pat Francis of RFP Consulting, to handle maintenance, repair and updates for the web site. Unfortunately, when Mr. Pans advised our Internet Service Provider, Interland.com, with the information of the change, Interland took the site down off the web. At this time the site is back up and FHP expects to start performing the maintenance and additions we have planned toward the end of April.

Vince Lombardi was appointed by the Executive Board to act as the ad hoc Website Committee Chair and to act as the liaison between the board and FHP Consulting.

## REPLACEMENT ELECTIONS

As a result of the resignation of Steve Long as President, the Executive Board appointed me as President Pro-Tem and moved Chris Brewster back to Past President/Advisor. This left an Alternate Executive Delegate position open. We appointed Steve White to fill this position until the next election in November.
My appoint as President Pro-Tem was to be effective through this meeting. My intent through this process has been to complete the work previously mentioned, primarily through my experience as the former ULSA and CSLSA President. Because I have no desire to continue as President, I would recommend to the Board to elect a President Pro Tem to serve through the November meeting.
In November there is a routinely scheduled election of officers. I would suggest that you elect an individual, now, who you would want to be President for the next full term, and ideally, one who has experience on the Executive Board. That would give this individual the opportunity to hit the ground running, with a background of the Boards efforts and the ability to maintain the continuity and direction the Board has experienced the last decade.
My sole motivation in not staying on as President is the time constraints put upon me by my consulting work, which is outside the parameters of CSLSA's interests, and my belief that we need to have other, experienced people at the helm.

I. AGENCY CONTACTS

I REMAIN IN REGULAR COMMUNICATION WITH A NUMBER OF AGENCIES AND THEIR REPRESENTATIVES BY TELEPHONE AND THROUGH EMAIL ON A NUMBER OF TOPICS THAT CONCERN OUR STATE AND NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND PROFESSIONAL LIFESAVING IN GENERAL.
II. CSLSA FUND RAISING

AS THOSE OF YOU WHO ATTENDED OUR FALL MEETING IN CARLSBAD KNOW, WE HAD A PRESENTATION FROM JOHNNIE SURPRISE AND JOAN EWING, REPRESENTATIVES FROM PROFESSIONAL EVENT SOLUTIONS. P.E.S. IS A GROUP THAT SUPPORTS VARIOUS ORGANIZATIONS IN THEIR EFFORTS TO OBTAIN GRANTS AND FOR GENERAL FUND RAISING. SUBSEQUENT MEETINGS WITH P.E.S. RESULTED IN A CONTRACT PROPOSAL THAT CARRIED NO GUARANTEES AND INCLUDES A $30 \%$ FEE FOR ANY FUNDS THAT THE GROUP RAISES ON BEHALF OF OUR ORGANIZATION. ADDITIONALLY, 1 MET WITH SCOTT HUBBELL PRODUCTIONS. THESE MEETINGS RESULTED IN A CONTRACT PROPOSAL THAT LISTED APPROXIMATELY \$480,000.00 IN GOODS, SERVICES AND CASH TO CSLSA OVER A FIVE-YEAR PERIOD. AFTER DELIBERATION, THE BOARD SELECTED THE P.E.S. OFFER. SINCE THE FALL MEETING, A LOT OF MY TIME WAS SPENT WITH THIS ENDEAVOR.

# Introduced by Assembly Member Shelley 

February 22, 2001

An act to add Section 655.8 to the Harbors and Navigation Code, relating to personal watercraft.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST
AB 759, as introduced, Shelley. Personal watercraft: bans.
Existing law regulates the use of personal watercraft.
This bill would authorize any city, county, or city and county to adopt an ordinance to ban the use of personal watercraft in any navigable water within the jurisdiction of the city, county, or city and county, as prescribed.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: no. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

2 Navigation Code, to read:
3 655.8. (a) Any city, county, or city and county may adopt an 4 ordinance to ban the use of personal watercraft in any navigable 5 water within the jurisdiction of the city, county, or city and county.
6 (b) Any ordinance adopted pursuant to subdivision (a) shall 7 include the following provisions:
(1) Any citizen may commence a civil action on his or her own behalf against any person who is alleged to have violated, or to be in violation of, the ordinance. "Citizen," for purposes of the
ordinance, means either a person who resides in this state, or a corporation, partnership, or association that maintains its principal office in this state, and that has an interest that is, or may be, adversely impacted.
(2) A violation of the ordinance is punishable by a fine of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the first infraction, seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750) for the second infraction, and one thousand five hundred dollars $(\$ 1,500)$ for the third infraction and each subsequent infraction.
(3) Signs shall be posted where personal watercraft have the ability to launch that include a telephone number that can be used by the public to report violations of the ordinance.
(4) A court, in issuing a final order regarding the ordinance, may award costs of litigation, including reasonable attorney and expert witness fees, to any prevailing or substantially prevailing party who brought the underlying action. If a temporary restraining order or preliminary injunction is sought by the citizen, the court may require a filing of a bond or other undertaking in accordance with state law and local court rules.
(5) Nothing in the ordinance shall restrict any right that any person may have under any statute, ordinance, or common law to seek enforcement of any requirement prescribed by the ordinance, or to seek any other relief. Nothing in the ordinance shall restrict any city, county, or city and county from bringing administrative, civil, or criminal action, or obtaining any remedy or sanction against any person to enforce any requirement set forth in the ordinance.
(6) If any provision of the ordinance, or application of the ordinance to any person or circumstance, is held invalid by a court, that invalidity shall not affect the other provisions or applications of the ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of the ordinance are severable.

# Introduced by Assembly Member Vargas (Coauthors: Assembly Members Bates, Kehoe, La Suer, Strom-Martin, Washington, Wayne, and Zettel) <br> (Coauthor: Senator Alpert) 

February 22, 2001

An act to add Section 3212.10 to the Labor Code, relating to workers' compensation.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST
AB 663, as amended, Vargas. Workers' compensation: lifeguards.
Underexisting Existing law,a person injured provides that an injury of an employee arising out of and in the course of employment is generally entitled to reeeive workers' compensation benefits-on acount of that injury compensable through the workers' compensation system. Existing law provides that, in the case of certain law enforcement officers and firefighters, the term "injury" includes heart trouble, hernia, pneumonia, and other injuries and diseases.

This bill would extend these these provisions to lifeguards employed by certain publie local agencies and would define the term "injury" to inelude the Department of Parks and Recreation with respect to cancer, leukemia, hernia, heart trouble, pneumonia, tuberculosis, hepatitis, or meningitis that develops or manifests itself during the period of the lifeguard's employment.

## AB 663

- 2 -

This bill would further create a rebuttable presumption that the above injuries and diseases arise out and in the course of the lifeguard's employment if they develop or manifest during the period of the employment.
Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 3212.10 is added to the Labor Code, to read:
3212.10. This section applies to lifeguards both of the following: (a) active lifeguards employed by a city, county, city and county, district, or other public or municipal corporation or political subdivision, and (b) state lifeguards employed by the Department of Parks and Recreation. The term "injury," as used in this division, includes cancer, leukemia, hernia, heart trouble, pneumonia, tuberculosis, hepatitis, or meningitis that develops or manifests itself during the period of the lifeguard's employment. The compensation awarded for sueh that injury shall include full hospital, surgical, and medical treatment, disability indemnity, and death benefits, as provided by the provisions of this division. Cancer, leukemia, hernia, heart trouble, pneumonia, tuberculosis, hepatitis; or meningitis so developing or manifesting itself shall be presumed to arise out of and in the course of the employment. This presumption is disputable and may be controverted by other evidence, but unless so controverted, the appeals board shall find in accordance with it. This presumption shall be extended to a lifeguard following termination of service for a period of three calendar months for each full year of the requisite service, but not to exceed 60 months in any circumstance, commencing with the last date actually worked in the specified capacity.

Cancer, leukemia, hernia, heart trouble, pneumonia, tuberculosis, heatitis, or meningitis so developing or manifesting itself in these cases shall not be attributed to any disease existing prior to sueh that development or manifestation.

# Introduced by Assembly Member Hollingsworth 

February 23, 2001

An act to add Section 663.8 to the Harbors and Navigation Code, relating to vessels.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST
AB 1410, as introduced, Hollingsworth. Vessels: use prohibitions. Existing law requires undocumented vessels to be numbered by the Department of Motor Vehicles and prescribes fees for the issuance and renewal of a certification of numbering. Existing law also requires the fees to be deposited in the Harbors and Watercraft Revolving Fund. The moneys from the fees are continuously appropriated to the Department of Motor Vehicles to administer the registration program and any excess is continuously appropriated to the Department of Boating and Waterways for grants to counties, public agencies in counties, and the Department of Parks and Recreation for boating safety and enforcement.

This bill would require the Department of Boating and Waterways to withhold numbering fees, sales taxes, and property taxes derived from types of undocumented vessels from counties and cities that prohibit use of those types of vessels. The bill would also prohibit grants to be made to those counties for public launch ramps or boating facilities.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 663.8 is added to the Harbors and Navigation Code, to read:
663.8. (a) A county or municipality that prohibits the use of any type of undocumented vessel, as defined in subdivision (g) of Section 9840 of the Vehicle Code, and numbered pursuant to Division 3.5 (commencing with Section 9840) of the Vehicle Code in all navigable waterways under its jurisdiction is subject to the following:
(1) Any amounts appropriated to the department pursuant to Section 9863 of the Vehicle Code for expenditure in accordance with Section 663.7 from registration fees paid for any banned vessel shall be retained by the department and shall not be used by, on behalf of, or within, the county or municipality that has banned the use of the vessel. The amounts withheld shall be reallocated to those counties that permit use of that type of vessel.
(2) Any amounts of sales or use taxes derived from the sale of banned vessels in the county or city, otherwise allocated to the county or city, shall be retained by the state.
(3) Any personal property taxes levied on banned vessels in the county or city, otherwise allocated to the county or city, shall be retained by the state.
(4) The department shall not accept an application for grant money, or grant money under its control to any county or city subject to this section for public launch ramp or boating facility improvements.
(b) For purposes of this section, "banned vessel" means an undocumented vessel, as defined in subdivision (g) of Section 9840 of the Vehicle Code and numbered pursuant to Division 3.5 (commencing with Section 9840) of the Vehicle Code, that is of a type prohibited from use in the navigable waters under the jurisdiction of the city or county subject to this section.

The Regionals will return to Imperial Beach in 2001on July 12 and 13. The Junior Lifeguard events will be on the $13^{\text {th }}$. I haven't heard much from the Imperial Beach organizers, so I trust all is going well. With a little cooperation from the weather and the water, the 2001 Regional Championships should be great.

We need a site for Regionals in 2002 and 2003. We are looking for a two-year commitment for both the lifeguard and JG Championships on back-to-back days. Any interested parties please let us know.

## USLA NATIONALS

The 2001 USLA Nationals will be at Lummus Park and Beach between $8^{\text {th }}$ and $10^{\text {th }}$ Streets in South Beach, Miami. From the discussions l've had with the organizers, preparations appear to be going well. There are still some logistical details that need to be worked out, but I'm confident the 2001 Nationals will be a success. Check the USLA website and www. uslanationals.org for more details. We will be picking the team to compete for the USA at Rescue 2002 in Daytona Beach from the Miami event, and I hope we can confirm a 50-meter pool for trials on August 12, the Sunday following Nationals. The Swimming Hall of Fame pool in Ft. Lauderdale has been proposed, but I have not yet received a confirmation from Jim McCrady of Ft. Lauderdale.

We will be returning to San Diego for Nationals in 2002.

## GOODWILL GAMES

The Goodwill Games will be in Brisbane, Queensland, Australia September 1 and 2, 2001 at Kurrawa Beach on the Gold Coast. The competition will be a team based surf competition, consisting of twelve events, both team and individual, with team point scoring and prize money. USLA President Don Rohrer appointed Tim Gallagher to the manager/coach position. There is $\$ 100,000$ (Australian) prize money being awarded to the teams based on their placing each day and overall. Team trials are planned for June 21, 22 and 23 at Ocean Beach in San Diego. We must finalize the plans at next month's USLA National Meeting. I will work with Tim Gallagher and the members of the committee to confirm a schedule of events.

## RULE CHANGES

Based on Committee action at the Fall 2000 Meeting in Newport Beach, we now have two categories for the National Championship Team Award. There is a Division A Championship for teams of 101 employees or more, and a Division B Championship for teams of 100 employees or less. An employee is defined as anyone who could work for any agency within a given Chapter.

The other rule change adopted at Newport clarified the "Beanie Rule" (4.3 of the National Championship rules). The rule now states that a competitor must start and finish each event with their CURRENT OFFICIAL CHAPTER beanie on their head.

Committee action at the Newport Beach meeting affecting the competition rules included eliminating the " M " course in the Ironman (it was instituted on a trial basis). It was also decided that the Individual High Point man and woman awards should only count "Open" points, including relays. It was suggested that we eliminate start times for events from the Rulebook and future event programs. Charlie Hartl of the Mid Atlantic Region was to develop and produce a "marshalling chip" to help in assigning competitors their lane at Nationals. Further committee action limited foreign competitors to individual events only. It was suggested that future National Competitions fund a minimum of 30 Officials.

The penalties for fighting were spelled out and were part of the November 4, 2000 Competition Committee Report. Funding was approved to replace the lost Sheridan Byerly Regional High Point Trophy, but the trophy has subsequently been found! Finally, the committee voted to eliminate the "March On" from future National Competitions.

As you know, US Ocean Safety Lifeguards provide all marine safety services to the County of Orange under a contract agreement. ## USLA RULE CHANGE PROPOSALS

## Rule 1.8 ELIGIBILITY

ELIGIBILITY -- Each individual must be a bona-fide PROFESSIONAL REGULAR MEMBER in good standing of a USLA Chapter lifeguard service or a retired professional lifeguard receiving a pension from said lifeguard service. A NON PROFESSIONAL MEMBER may compete if they were a professional member for three seasonslyears and maintain their membership in the USLA. Non- professional members must donate 24 hours a season to their USLA Chapter Lifeguard Agency in service not connected to competition. An application for a non-professional member must be submitted to the USLA Gompetition Chairman. INDIVIDUALS may compete if they were a bona-fide REGULAR MEMBER of a USLA Chapter for three calendar years, and are now a current member of a USLA Chapter in good standing. All such Individuals may only compete for a USLA Chapter in which they were formerly a member in good standing. Foreign competitors must apply in writing to the USLA National Competition Committee Chairman for a waiver of eligibility requirements and will not be eligible for awards or points. COMPETITORS must have paid their USLA dues prior to commencement of USLA Championships.

## COMPETITION DISTANCES

Amend the USLA National Lifeguard Championship distances to bring them into alignment with International Competition Rules. In addition to making the courses more "spectator friendly," this change would also help our competitions run faster (since the distance of each race would be shorter), and would enable us to choose the most competitive members to represent us in International competition. This change would not apply to the Surfboat Race.

Our proposal is to change the distances to those on the accompanying diagram. This will preserve our current course setup, while accomplishing our goal of adopting International distances. All distances are approximate, and are minimums, depending on surf conditions.

The International Distance Run is 2000 M ( 1000 M for Masters Age Groups), made up of four (two) legs of 500 M each.
